## National Barn Alliance chooses Mars Hill for meeting

#### President holds annual event with board members via Zoom

MARS HILL - The Appalachian Barn Alliance was honored to be chosen to host the president of the National Barn Alliance on the weekend of the Appalachian Barn Alliance ninth annual Barn Day tour and dinner Sept. 13-14.

President Michael Spencer chose this weekend to hold the National Barn Alliance's annual meeting via  $\operatorname{Zoom}$  — as the board members who live in New York, Michigan, Illinois and California – Sept. 14 using the Mars Hill library.

Spencer's wife, Danae Peckler (and former president of the National Barn Alliance), as well as their daughter, Estella, were also on hand. The family lives in Fredericksburg, Virginia, where Spencer serves as associate professor in the department of Historic Preservation at the University of Mary Washington and director of The Center for Historic Preservation.

Peckler serves as the preservationist with the Historic Fredericksburg Foundation.

The National Barn Alliance was founded in 1995. It has close to 100 members carrying out its mission to "preserve and protect rural heritage through education, documentation, conservation and networking" striving to raise awareness for the need to save America's historic barns.

Later in the day, Danae, Michael and Estella were able to join the Appalachian Barn Alliance Barn Day tour, which was guided by Appalachian Barn Alliance researcher Taylor Barnhill. The tour included up-close stops at three farms in the Mars Hill area.

They learned more about the Appalachian Barn Alliance model and interacted with other tour participants to hear their comments and questions on the tour.

"We were surprised how engaged the tour participants were, how good their questions were," Spencer said.

On the morning of Sept. 15, Barnhill took them on a 90-minute tour of the barns on the Smith Farm.

Both Peckler and Spencer were im-

curriculum and field work in the future. The Appalachian Barn Alliance welcomes their assistance and substantive support to help better document this rich history and culture. Hopefully we will have the pleasure to see them again in future and to share more of our county's agricultural heritage with them.
